Dear Parent(s) / Guardian(s),

Your child's school is currently engaged in an arts and creativity in education initiative where your child's class and their teacher are developing creative practice in their school, sometimes with the help of artists and other creative practitioners. They are taking part in a Department of Education led initiative of the Creative Youth pillar of Creative Ireland 2023-27 which includes Creative Clusters, Teacher Artist Partnership+, BLAST and I am Creative. These initiatives are administered by National Arts in Education (NAE), Tralee Education Support Centre with the support of the Education Support Centres Ireland network.

We aim to support, share, and celebrate the work of children and young people in our school-based initiatives and ask for your permission and that of the students to share their experience of learning through creativity. The Department of Education and Creative Ireland may wish to use photo/ video/ audio/ written materials for archival, research or public engagement purposes which include official Government websites, reports, media and/or social media channels.

What material will be gathered, and how will it be used?

- Your child's learning and work may be gathered in a variety of ways, including photo/video/audio and/or written materials.
- This photo/video/audio and/or written material may be used by the Department of Education, Creative Ireland, National Arts in Education and your local Education Support Centre to share and celebrate the work of Creative Youth and to support teacher/school leader professional learning experiences.
- Your child can stop taking part in project documentation / recording at any stage. Your child's surname will not be used in the published material.

What are your rights regarding personal data?

You and your child have the following rights, in certain circumstances and subject to applicable exemptions, in relation to the personal data we hold:-

- the right to access the personal data and information about our processing of that personal data
- the right to require us to correct any inaccuracies in the personal data
- the right to require us to erase the personal data
- the right to request that we no longer process the personal data for particular purposes
- the right to object to our use of the personal data or the way in which we process it
